As We Gather:

Arise, shine! Matthew tells the familiar story of the wise men who did exactly that, following an evening star in search of the newborn Morning Star. Upon entering the house, they kneel down and pay homage to King Jesus (which they did *not* do for King Herod). Gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh are given. These are gifts fit for a king and perhaps are meant to convey allegorical hints about Jesus' identity. But they are gifts without much utility or purpose in the moment. So what shall we give to Jesus? In Jesus, the God who has everything is now the God who has given everything; all God desires in return is for your heart to find faith in Christ.

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.






