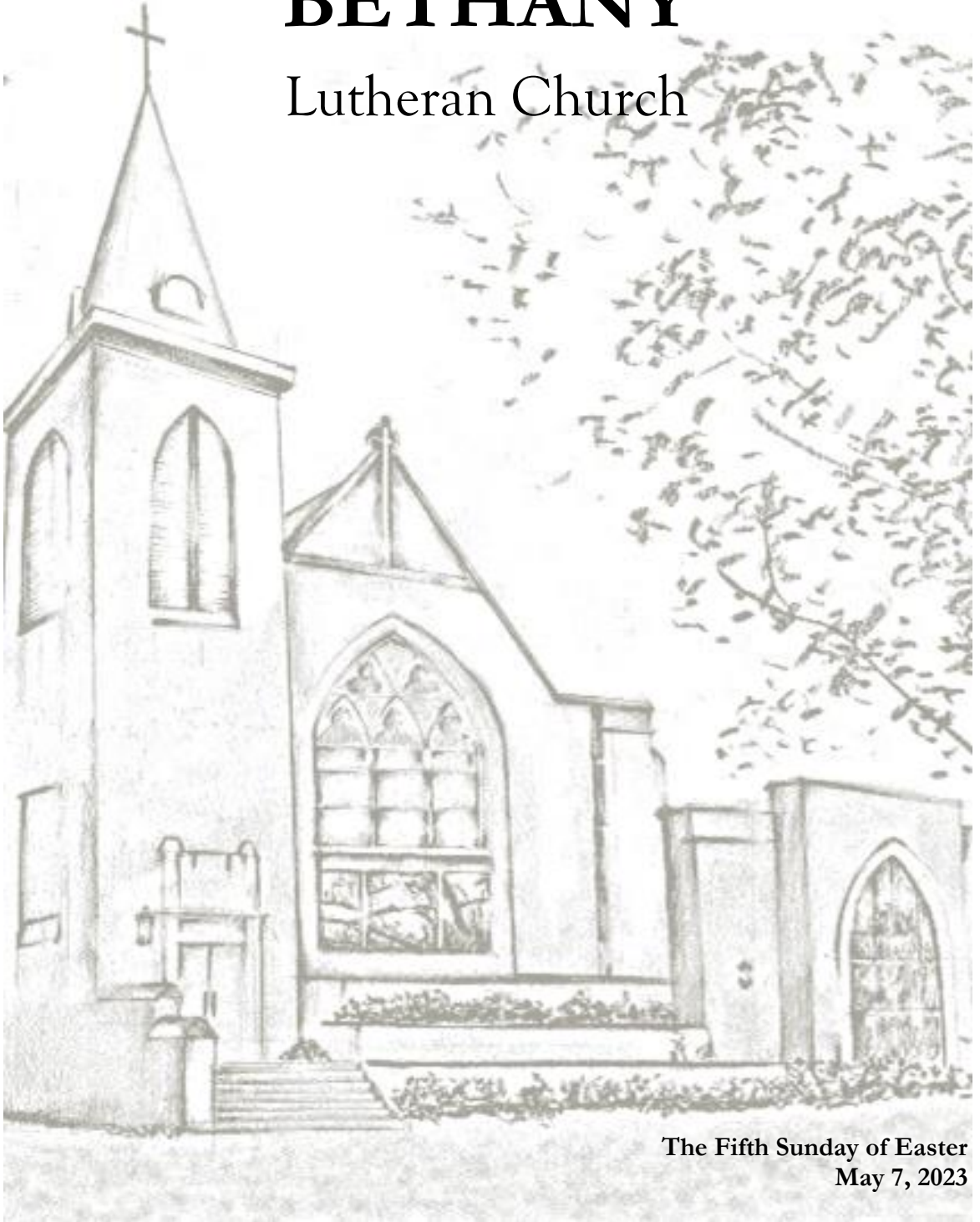

As We Gather:

On the night of his betrayal, Jesus speaks words of comfort and hope to his friends, pointing to his Father's house in which there is room enough for all those claimed by God in Christ. It is tempting to imagine that these words are only about the future, a simplistic claim that there will be somewhere for us to go when we die. While this is perfectly true, it fails to capture the full scope of God's promises. Peter later writes of the Kingdom God is building, a Kingdom that is not a place to which we are going but is rather what God is building in and through us, here and now. We are living stones built upon the strong cornerstone that is Jesus Christ. While we wait for the fullness of the Kingdom, we also rejoice that God is building the Kingdom for us, in us, today. The Church manifests this mission in many ways, including through Lutheran Social Services of Illinois, amongst other agencies. This morning, we are blessed to have representatives from LSSI join us to speak of their work toward God's Kingdom on earth.

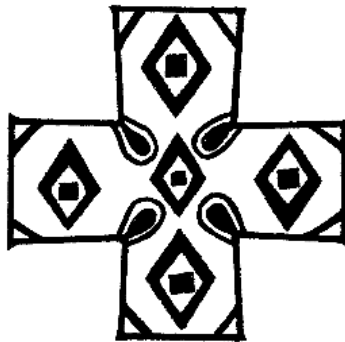
