As We Gather:

As parents, there are few values we try to inculcate more than honesty. As ethicists, we shy away from contextual conditionality when it comes to telling the truth. In short, honesty is always good and lying is always bad. Right? So what gives with today's parable? Jesus tells the story of a dishonest manager who gets in trouble with his master. In response, the dishonest manager becomes more dishonest - and the master rewards him for it! Jesus holds up the shrewd steward as a paradigm for the "children of light" to emulate. What gives? Well, maybe in response to the rampant dishonesty in service to the self, what we need is some creative accounting for the benefit of this world's poor and downtrodden. If we're going to be cheats and liars, let's do it to help others! But more than that, this parable tells us about Jesus, the great cooker of the divine books, the shredder of old accounts, the One who does away with the bill so that we can join him in his eternal home.

COMMISSIONING OF SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS AND STAFF

During the Hymn of the Day, we invite our Sunday School teachers to come forward for their commissioning...

Pastor: In Christian love, you, the parents and families of this congregation, presented your children for Holy Baptism just as you yourself were Baptized. In baptism, sacred promises are made. It is your calling to keep these scared promises:

- To faithfully come AND bring others to the services of God's house.

Teachers: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Emma: Will you be diligent in your study of the Holy Scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace and prayer?

Teachers: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Emma: Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

Emma: I now commend you as teachers of our Sunday School program at Bethany, in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.






