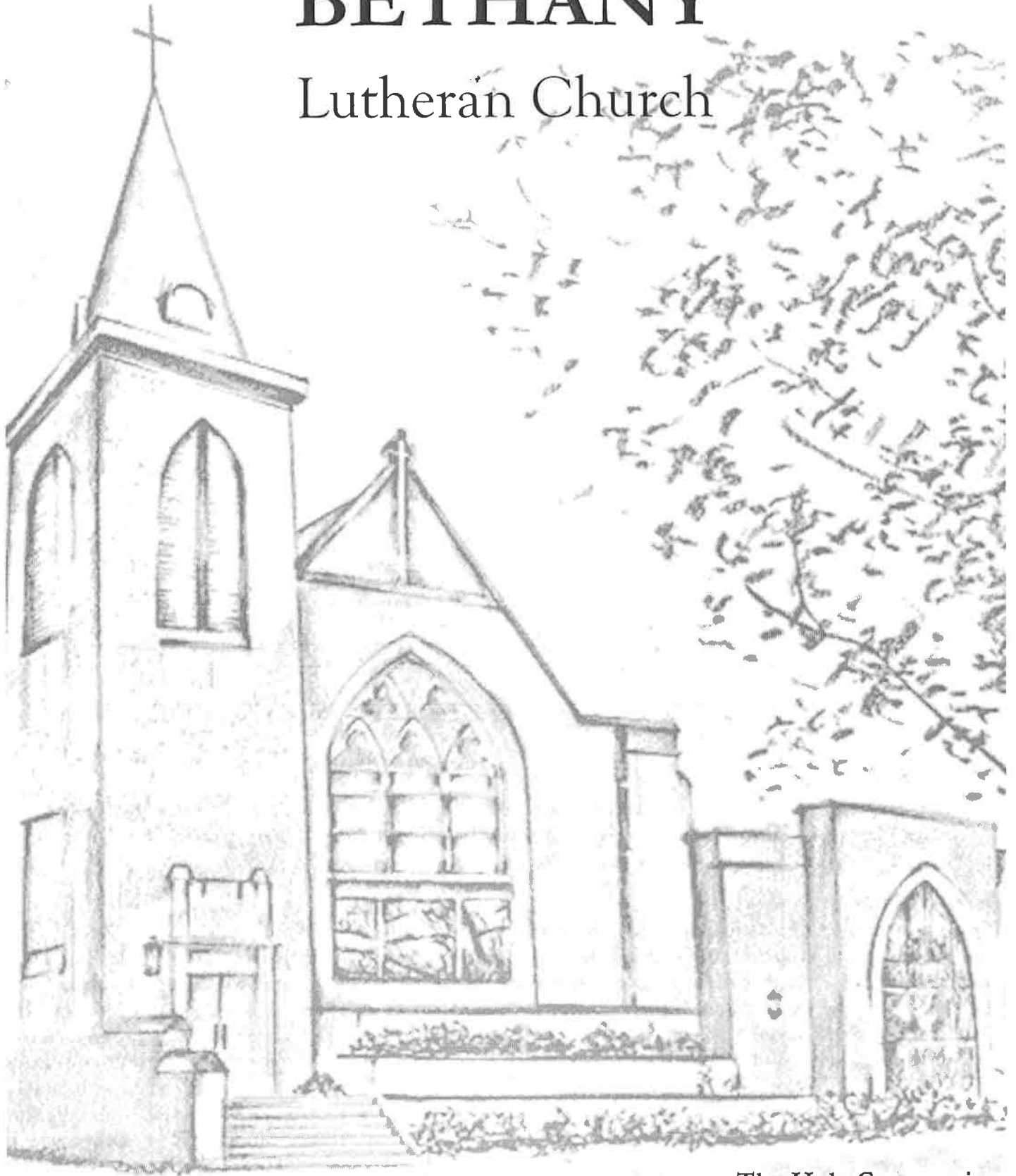

In Holy Communion the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. All baptized Christians are invited to the table where Christ himself is host. If you desire to be baptized, or to learn more about Holy Baptism, please speak to the pastor.

As We Gather:

Pride comes in at least two expressions. One form of pride is necessary for life to flourish. We all need pride in work, pride in being, even pride in appearance, in order to function as healthy individuals and strive for excellence in life and service. The other form of pride, however, stands against all life but its own. It regards others "with contempt" (Luke 18:9); holds only itself "righteous" (Luke 18:9); trusts in its own abilities and commitments alone. Jesus speaks forcefully against this form of pride. What matters to Jesus? The tax collector is offered as an image. He stood "far off" from the temple, hardly daring to enter. He could stand only on mercy and mercy alone. What matters? Humility, awareness that for all the good we do, life—and our relationship with God—finally depends upon God. Humility: a constant realization that for all the good we do, we remain broken, unable to hold it all together before God. Humility: hunger to live by and through grace. Hunger to live through mercy. Hunger to trust all to God.

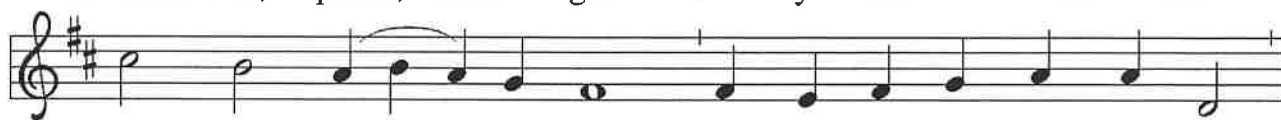

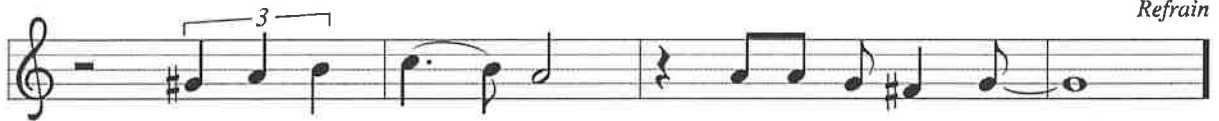
