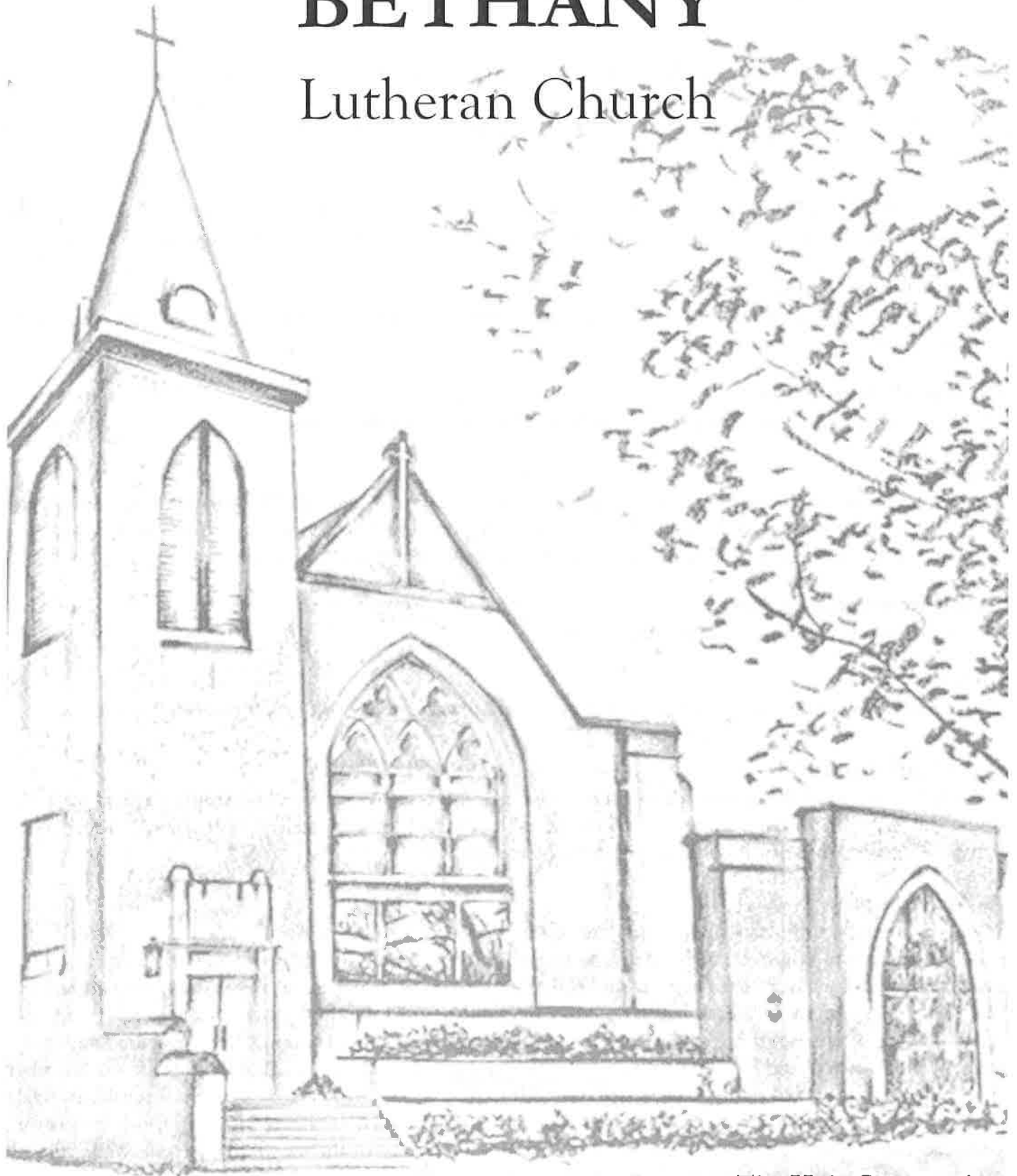

As We Gather:

While the disciples are struck by the grandeur of the Jerusalem Temple, Jesus tells them that it will all soon fall apart. Not one stone will be left upon another. Worse, wars will rage and natural disasters will occur. Worse yet, *you* will suffer betrayal and isolation because of Jesus' name. To sum up, the bad news is that there will continue to be bad news. So it is today, and so will it be until Jesus returns to put things to rights. In this in-between time, where does the gaze of faith look? Always upon Christ, crucified and raised. In him, all evil and brokenness have been put to death. In him, we see that there is life on the other side of death. The sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings, just as Malachi foretold. In the meantime, we neither ignore nor forsake our calling in *this* world. With hope and love we work for justice and peace, even while things fall apart, because these are the values of the kingdom that will come. The bad news remains, but not forever. The good news is simply too good.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT LITANY

P A land acknowledgment is a traditional custom in many Native communities and nations to show respect to the people of the land since time immemorial. The importance of land acknowledgments for non-indigenous individuals and communities relies on the recognition of their relationship to the original inhabitants of a location and its land. Furthermore, it is a way to show respect and gratitude to the traditional stewards of a specific location.

As we begin worship today, we take a moment to recognize and remember the Native brothers and sisters who are the first peoples of these lands. The Potawatomi people inhabited this area for several centuries. We honor their presence here, and thank God for their work, play, and stewardship of this land in the past. Most of all, we pray for our Potawatomi brothers and sisters today.

Creator God, we thank you for the diversity of us, your children, in the world...both past and present. We especially remember before you today the Potawatomi people who inhabited these lands before us.

C **We recognize the stewardship and blessing of those who cared for these lands we now inhabit.**

P Forgive us, those of us who are immigrants to and settlers in this country, for so often forgetting that we are guests of the First Nations people of North America.

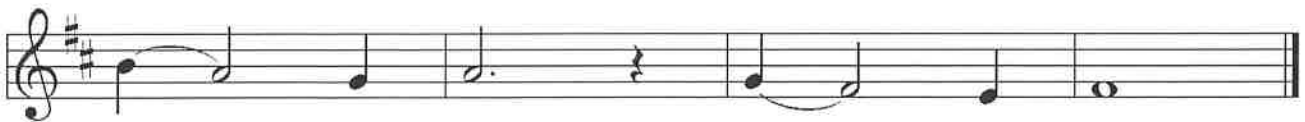

Gluten-FREE rice wafers are available upon request and for those desiring it, non-alcoholic wine cups are in the center of the tray.

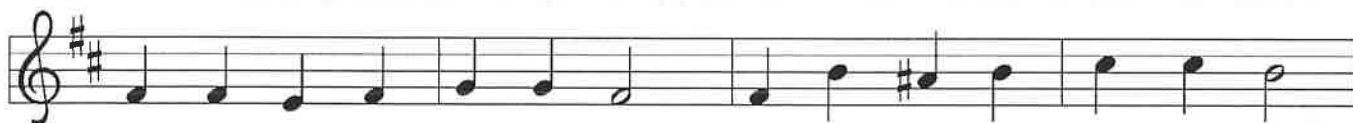
