
READING: Isaiah 52:7–10

HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-14



NICENE CREED

- A Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith:


Finally, bring us and all your people to the heavenly home where we will stand in the full light of your glory, and with all your saints and angels sing the everlasting song of triumph.
